

## **Fights at Wedding a Common Occurrence**

Aside from the upset caused on the day, some of these feuds can last several years. Long standing disagreements can be the cause of many of these problems, as the occasion means that many who would not socialise with certain parties, are thrown together for the celebration of a wedding.

Several comments allude to the so called fact that it may well be down to class, whereas others mute the opinion that alcohol breaks all class barriers and therefore any problems are likely, irrespective of class. Whatever the opinion, it is a fact that trouble at a wedding occurs more frequently than would be expected.

Which in itself is a shame, as it deters from the occasion and causes unnecessary unpleasantness, which will be the reasons for remembering the occasion rather than the union of two people in matrimony.

For those planning a wedding, there are enough distractions and concerns, without considering bodyguards to keep the peace. However to put this poll into context, the same poll indicated that 64% of people responded with the reply that no fights had broken out, which provides some comfort.
